

Monster Phonics Foundations Programme for Pre School

The Foundations Programme develops speaking and listening skills. Children learn to become attuned to the sounds and begin to develop oral blending and segmenting skills. This teaching lays the foundations for teaching of systematic synthetic phonics.

The government Phase 1 curriculum consists of 7 aspects. Each aspect contains 3 strands:

- Tuning into sounds (auditory discrimination)
- Listening and remembering sounds (auditory memory and sequencing)
- Talking about sounds (developing vocabulary and language comprehension)

Teaching Progression

Each of the first six aspects should be dipped into by teaching one of the activities provided, rather than teaching the aspects in order. Aspect 7 can be taught once children have had opportunity to develop their sound discrimination skills. Each activity can be taught over two or more sessions.

Aspect 1 – General sound discrimination – environmental sounds

The aim of this aspect is to raise children's awareness of the sounds around them and to develop their listening skills.

Aspect 2 – General sound discrimination – instrumental sounds

This aspect aims to develop children's awareness of sounds made by various instruments and noise makers.

Aspect 3 – General sound discrimination – body percussion

The aim of this aspect is to develop children's awareness of sounds and rhythms.

Aspect 4 – Rhythm and rhyme

This aspect aims to develop children's appreciation and experiences of rhythm and rhyme in speech.

Aspect 5 – Alliteration

The focus is on the initial sounds of words.

Aspect 6 – Voice sounds

The aim is to distinguish between different vocal sounds and to begin oral blending and segmenting.

Aspect 7 – Oral blending and segmenting

The main aim is to develop oral blending and segmenting skills.
